

How to help the Paget Safer Routes scheme in Burton

Children

- Walk or cycle to school more often.
- Find a safe route to school and use it.
- Use safe crossing places whenever possible.
- Remember the road safety training, which you've been given at school.

Parents / Drivers

- Please help your children learn how to cross the road safely.
- Set a good example when walking yourself.
- Encourage your children to walk regularly. They will be fitter and healthier.
- Keep within the speed limits at all times.
- Please park well away from school gates and park considerately.
- Consider parking further from school and walking the rest of the way.

The Safer Routes to Schools scheme has involved the following:

- Local schools, parents and pupils;
- Staffordshire County Council – Staffordshire Highways, East Staffordshire Borough Council and the Road Safety and Sustainable Travel Unit;
- County, District and Parish Councillors;
- Staffordshire Ambulance, Fire and Rescue and Police services.

Improvements made in Burton during the Paget Safer Routes to School scheme (2003-2008)



Pedestrian guard railing to segregate children from vehicles at Belvedere Junior School.



New pedestrian crossing facilities on all four arms at the busy Dallow Street / Victoria Crescent crossroads. This benefits three schools and the local community.

New uncontrolled crossing with new areas of footway inclusive of dropped kerbs and tactile paving on Belvoir Road outside St. Modwen's Roman Catholic Primary School.



Improved central refuge to aid pedestrians crossing the wide junction of Outwoods Street.



New pedestrian crossing facilities and improved crossing facilities at the junction of Evershed Way and Uxbridge Street.



New uncontrolled crossing on Belvedere Road to assist School Crossing Patrol (SCP) point, with flashing SCP beacons and footway build-outs both sides to improve visibility.



Improved pedestrian facilities at the junction of Jephson Road and Burton Road.



New cycle storage at Paget High School purpose built to the school's specification.
