When the number of reported killed or seriously injured (KSI) casualties per 100 million vehicle kilometres for county or unitary authorities is examined, Staffordshire ranks the highest. This is due to the fact that in 2008, Staffordshire only had 3 KSI casualties per 100 million vehicle kilometre. However, 3 KSI casualties is 3 too many and the Partnership continues to endeavour to reduce this number further.

For the most recent 12 month period up until September 2009, KSI casualty data highlights that in Staffordshire there were 312 KSI casualties. This ranks the area 8<sup>th</sup> overall; however the table on the next page highlights a higher ranking for Staffordshire as a figure per head of population (using per 100,000 as a weighting) has been incorporated.

Incorporating the weighting of a 100,000 population for reported KSI casualties for the most recent 12 months, Staffordshire's ranking moves to joint third. However, there were 29 reported KSI casualties in Staffordshire per 100,000 people, which is just one more than South Wales and Devon and Cornwall.

If you compare our figure with the police force of Nottinghamshire which has a similar population, their ranking is joint 32<sup>nd</sup> as they has a total of 595 KSI casualties for the most recent 12 months data which relates to 56 KSI casualties per 100,000 population.
